The Master of Arts in Counseling licensure program is designed to equip students to be biblically and empirically-based practitioners, grounded in theories and skills to counsel individuals, couples, and families from a scholar-practitioner and Christian worldview. The licensure track meets the Texas State Board of Examiners of Professional Counselors requirements for graduates to sit for the National Counselor Examination and the Texas Jurisprudence Examination. Upon successful completion graduates may apply for a Licensed Professional Counselor-Intern license to subsequently pursue meeting the 3000 hours required post-intern licensure, to then become a Licensed Professional Counselor.
