I want to lead a church towards Christlikeness


I want to be the best mother and wife (husband and dad)



What is an Image Bearer?

• Persons are Self-aware, "I am"

(John 1:2; John 8:56-59; Exodus 3:14)

 Persons are beings who exhibit mind, will, and emotions.

 Persons are Capable of Harmonious I/Thou Relationship

(Matt 18:20; 1 Cor 12:25-27; 1 John 1:7; Rom 12:16)

What is an Image Bearer?




• Persons can indwell one another

(Gen 2; Matt 19:5; 1 Cor 6:17, Eph 5:31-32)

 Persons can reflect the moral character of God

(Matt 5:48; 1 Cor 13; Gal 5:19-21)



SOCIAL MODEL OF THE TRINITY

A focus on the Persons of the Trinity and the relationship of each person one to the other

The Trinity

- The one God exists eternally
- as three Persons,
- God the Father,
- God the Son,
- & God the Spirit,
- One in nature, equal in glory and distinct in relations.






In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He (the Word) was with God in the beginning. (John 1:1)

I and the Father are One (John 10:30)

No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known. (1 John 4:12)



Perichoretic Indwelling:

On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you (John 14:20)



I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me. (John 17:23)



The Persons love One another

(John 14:31; Mark 9:7; Matt 3:17)

The Persons glorify One another

(John 16:14, 17:1, 4-5)

The Persons honor One another (value, respect, revere) (John 5:22-23; 8:49, 54)

The Persons please One another

(John 8:29, Matt 3:17, 17:5)

The Spirit testifies of the Son (John 16:14-15)

The persons KNOW one another intimately (epiginosko) (Matt 11:27; John 10:15



The Persons communicate with one another (John 10:18, 15:15)

The Persons work with and for one another (John 5:17; 4:34)

The Son submits to the will of the Father (Matt 26:39, John 14:19)

The Spirit Speaks the Word of the Father (John 3:31)

The Persons give gifts to one another (James 1:17; John 3:35)

The Persons abide in unity and love (John 10:3; 14:10, 20)

The Persons enjoy fellowship of the Other (John 1:18; John 17)




Prior to Creation, the Persons of the Trinity, Father, Son, and Spirit existed in eternal delight and joy, loving one another.

C.S. Lewis describes a perpetual dance of joy. (Perelandra)
